BIRTH CENTER



Labor and Delivery, Obstetrical IMC and Mother-Baby Unit

HSHS St. John's Hospital is proud to be designated a Level III Administrative Perinatal Center. St. John's provides the highest level of care for mothers and babies within a 37-county area in south-central Illinois.

The Birth Center welcomes more than 1,800 babies every year. The OB-IMC antenatal unit (located within the Birth Center) is staffed by maternal/fetal medicine specialists 24/7 for expectant mothers who may need extra care for issues such as pre-term labor or high blood pressure. In addition, should an emergency arise, a board-certified obstetrician is in the hospital at all times.

In May 1998, St. John's was the first hospital in the Midwest to receive the Baby Friendly designation. Baby Friendly USA awarded the certification after a rigorous on-site survey. This prestigious designation has been awarded to only 172 hospitals in the United States. St. John's Baby Friendly designation has been renewed every five years, most recently in January 2014. Currently, there are only four Baby Friendly hospitals in Illinois, including St. John's.

The process of a "gentle cesarean" begins when the baby is delivered. The mother is shown the infant prior to going to the warmer for assessment. After the mother and baby are assessed by the nurse, anesthesiologist and obstetrician, the infant is placed on the mother's chest and covered with warm blankets.




